

## Dissertations and Theses H 1570

**BACKGROUND:** *Bibliographies of dissertations and theses may be general in nature, or limited to a particular subject. They may also list those items accepted by a particular institution or the institutions collectively of a particular geographic area. For classification of bibliographies and catalogs of dissertations and theses, see F 585.*

**1. General rule.** Assign to a bibliography of dissertations and/or theses the appropriate combination of the following subject headings:

6XX X0 \$a [*subject or name heading*] \$v Bibliography.  
[Omit this heading if the work is not limited to a specific topic.]

610 X0 \$a [*institution*] \$x Dissertations \$v Bibliography.  
[Omit this heading if the work is not limited to a specific institution.]

650 #0 \$a Dissertations, Academic \$z [*country*] \$v Bibliography.

**2. Geographic subdivision.** When subdividing the heading **Dissertations, Academic** geographically, do not subdivide below the country level even when dealing with individual institutions. Subdivide only by names of countries or larger geographic units. For example, assign to a list of theses of Harvard University the heading **Dissertations, Academic–United States– Bibliography**.
