- Three essay questions (Please limit your response to 500 words each; clearly label/title each essay with the corresponding letter and question.)
  - a. What is the value of primary sources in education? Consider both your school setting and the larger field.
  - b. Please describe your use of Library of Congress primary sources. What teaching strategies have you used? What were the results? (Please include at least one illustrative example of work produced by you or a student.)
  - c. How would the Teacher-in-Residence position support your professional development goals?
- Project plan (clearly title/label)

Please provide a one to two page plan for a project that you will complete during or shortly after your year as Teacher-in-Residence, if you are selected. Your plan should include objectives, strategies, content description, intended recipients, timing and expected outcomes. Indicate who will supervise this project and who will collaborate with you on its implementation. Please provide letters of support from both of these individuals (see "a" below).
- Letters of support/recommendation
  - a. Two letters of recommendation/support:
    - One from a collaborating teacher
    - One from an administrator who will supervise your proposed project
  - b. A letter from an individual authorized to approve intergovernmental personnel agreements
- At least one illustrative example of teacher or student produced work to support essay question "b" above
- Current resume or curriculum vitae
